TO: DSO-AN – District Staff Officers – Aids to Navigation

Subject: Update on Navigation Systems Division Programs and other information.

1. Renaming of Aids to Navigation Division and change of DVC-ON title.

As you should be aware, the name of the Auxiliary Aids to Navigation Division has been changed to the "*Navigation Systems Division*" in order to realign the Auxiliary with the Coast Guard. The Division Chief designation is now "**DVC-MN**."

2. Renaming of Aids to Navigation (AN) Staff officers to Navigation Services (NS)

The current Aids to Navigation (AN) title for staff officers was changed to Navigation Systems (NS) to better reflect the expanded opportunities for Auxiliary involvement in the Coast Guard Navigation Systems program area. Activities included by the Coast Guard under Navigation Systems include visual navigation systems, vessel traffic services, E-navigation and Navigation Standards.

STATUS: This change was approved by EXCOM last June. Implementation of this change is pending guidance on an effective date.

3. Navigation Systems Program Updates

The Navigation Systems Division staff have been working for the past two years to review and update study guides, forms and training materials for use by NS (AN) staff officers in training their team volunteers and for developing and enhancing their local Navigation Systems (Aids to Navigation) programs. These training materials are currently in trial phase in First District Northern Region.

These guides, forms, training presentations, kits and handouts and background informational materials have been reviewed for current practices and accuracy for each of our five program areas – ATON-Federal Short Range Aids to Navigation, PATON-Private Aids to Navigation Program, BAP-Bridge Administration Program, CU-NOAA Chart Updating Program and SCF-NOAA Small Craft Facility Updating Program. The goal is to replace existing outdated materials with up-to-date information. Approval has been received from NOAA for the new CU and SCF guides and user forms.

Additionally, our goal is to minimize the requirement for paper reports and convert as many forms as possible to on-line preparation and submission. National review and approval is pending.

STATUS: Materials are at AUX Legal and are concurrently being reviewed by Navigation Systems Division at CG Headquarters. Target completion: unknown.

IMPLEMENTATION: Introduction is planned for **N-TRAIN 2009**. The current plan is to invite all DSO-NS(AN) to St. Louis in January, 2009 for the introductory presentations. More details to follow.
